Principal's Message

Math

As most of you know, I teach 5th - 8th grade Math. At Peoria Christian School, we use the Saxon Math book, which is not a Christian publisher, and it would teach that Math is neutral in nature; however, subjects are not neutral in nature. We learn that Mathematics is created by God to show His power, glory, and order in our world. We read in Colossians 1:16 that all things were created by God (including Math) by Him and for Him.

We then read in the very next verse that He also holds all things together. So, the same God that created Mathematics holds all the laws that He created to still apply today.

Over the next few weeks, we are planning to work on lessons 20 -30 in the book. We will see common themes such as: numbers and operations and problem solving. We can see God's order, design, and laws with these concepts. Students love to learn when they see God's amazing design and order even in Mathematics. Here are some upcoming Christian objectives that we will be using in class.



5th Grade Lesson 20: I can understand how God designed a division problem.

5th Grade lesson 21: I can understand God's design of an equal groups equation to solve word problems.

6th Grade Lesson 20: I can use God's law with finding the greatest common factor.

6th Grade Lesson 21: I can understand God's covenants with the divisibility tests with 2, 3, 5, 9, and 10.

7th Grade Lesson 20: I can use God's law with finding the area of a rectangle.

7th Grade Lesson 21: I can understand God's design of prime and composite numbers.

8th Grade Lesson 20: I can use God's law with finding the area of a triangle.

8th Grade Lesson 21: I can see God's order when solving problems by using the order of operations.

When you see these 5th - 8th grade students, please take time to ask them about what specifically they are learning in Math about God and His amazing order and design.

FACILITATORS


